As we move into a new calendar year, I encourage you to take note of the proposed budget found elsewhere in the pages of this edition of Grace Notes.

You may notice a splash of "red ink" in it. To cover the budget as requested or needed by the various arms of the church will require dipping into the church's reserve funds, based on the pledges gathered as of this writing. That would be new, at least in my time here. In fact, in some years we've had a surplus that carried over into the following year.

It isn't the case that any committee or group is making extravagant requests. Most notable is that this property is getting expensive to maintain, and there are a number of repairs and upgrades that need to be done. Some of those have sprung upon us in this past year, and others (such as roof work) are looming in forthcoming years.

Of course, I don't have to tell you that dipping into reserve funds isn't sustainable for a church any more than it is for any other organization.

Hopefully some folks have just been late with their pledges and some of this will even out. But this is something we need to be careful about.



I will be away for what has become a regular post-Advent/Christmas/Epiphany week of recovery, planning, and writing from January 8 (right after the morning service) through January 14. Something special will happen on Sunday morning, January 15. You will definitely want to plan to be here for it.

Lent comes quickly once the New Year kicks in, with Ash Wednesday on February 22. I hope to have a book study for those who are able to join in. The book is titled *Sowing Tears, Reaping Joy: The Bible and Brahms' Requiem*, by Carol M. Bechtel. It would most likely, like the recent Advent study, be conducted via Zoom on Tuesday evenings. I'm putting this out there now in case you'd like to go ahead and get a copy of the book. (You might also want to get a recording of the Brahms as well. That's never a bad thing to have around.)


