Sharing the Faith

“...the fruit of the Holy Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control,” Saint Paul tells us in his letter to the Galatians 5:22-23. As we move from the church season of Easter, beginning on Sunday, May 19th, we begin another season. In times past this new time was called “Ordinary Time.” But I call this new time “The season of the Spirit...” The Holy Spirit that is.

I like fruit; do you? I do; I like fruit a lot! I like berries, apples, bananas, and pears. Next to our condo in Ocala there once was an orange tree that produced in season, copious amounts of fruit, and these particular oranges were just delicious – really delicious! They were big and juicy and had just the right taste - a mix of sweet and tart. Unfortunately, because the squirrels liked those oranges, and apparently liked being in and around the house, the grounds crew decided to cut the tree down, but I still like fruit – berries, oranges, apples, bananas and pears...I like them all.

The thing about fruit, the kind of fruit that grows on trees anyway, is that it grows up high - higher fruit. I’ve noticed on that orange tree that was near our condo, that the fruit on the lower branches, because of their weight, were pulled down onto the ground. If gone un-harvested, the fruit either rotted or hence, various critters made quick use of them, which believe it or not, brings us back to Paul’s teaching to the Galatians. Paul, if you study his writings closely, is always leading, encouraging, pushing, and sometimes pulling the reader toward higher things. Having picked more than my share of fruit from that tree, I’ve noticed that the oranges closer to the top of the tree were unblemished, and seemed bigger, juicier, and ready to eat! – YUM!

The higher fruit that Paul’s letter speaks of pushes us to reach for what is a higher way to live our faith. The fruit of the Holy Spirit is an essential fruit if we are to understand that our calling as Christians is to seek the higher things of Jesus Christ. When we do this, seek the higher things, though it may take more effort, like when trying to reach the high fruit on that orange tree, but oh, the view from the top is spectacular, gives us true freedom, and reassures us that Jesus Christ is Lord of all!

Operating from Paul’s vantage point, up high and enjoying the fruit of the Holy Spirit and therefore loving more, enjoying more, experiencing more inner peace, being more kind and more generous, living more faithfully with a gentle heart and true self control, is the juiciest and most sacred fruit there is. From that vantage point, though it can be hard work to get up that high, we can see more clearly the One who planted the tree in the first place. We come to understand more clearly from that viewpoint that God not only planted the tree, but that Christ is the true vine, and that we are His branches who bear the highest fruit by the power of the Holy Spirit, through faith in the One who first loved us.

Reach higher for Jesus! It’s delicious! We’ll be talking about the Fruit of the Spirit in this new season of faith.

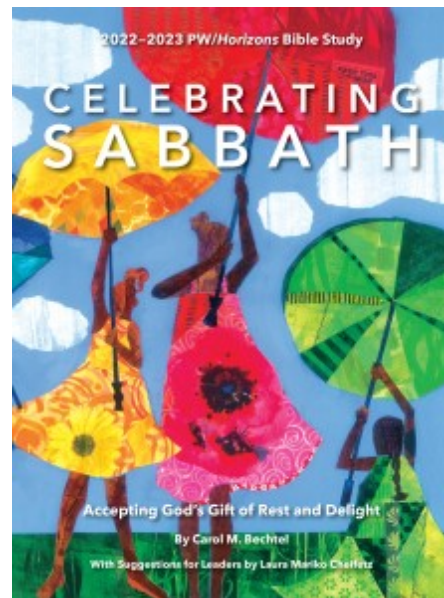
Men's Noon Lunch & Fellowship
