A friend from years ago, Rev. Carmen LaBerge, reached out to me recently and her musings fit the Christian season of Advent and Christmas. She called on Christians to not buy things but put ourselves into Christmas by making and sharing “Humble Pie”, a dish served warm, made with a ‘tender’ pie crust of fine flour sifted through our life, and gently mixed with the chilled sweet butter when we churn the milk of gratitude in conversation with God. Add a cup of cool water given to us, and roll out into 2 circles. Chill both and then fit one to conform to the shape of our pie shaped life. Fill it with the ripe fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, and self-control, taking care to remove any ‘stones and pits’. Once piled high with this superfruit, our top covering crust is cut and woven into basket weave top so everything inside can blend and expand without boiling over. A few left-over pieces of crust can be accent ‘leaves’, hearts and vines, so we leave nothing of ourselves out, and then sprinkle the sweetness and spice of God’s Word on top. All this then baked in a medium oven, timing it so the smell draws in those who were sure they didn’t need any dessert. Don’t put it aside for later, because every humble pie should be eaten with joy and grace and thanksgiving to God from whom all blessings flow. Amen.

Linda Z. at Art Studios of Grace has been getting great attendance at her Tuesday and Thursday night open studios



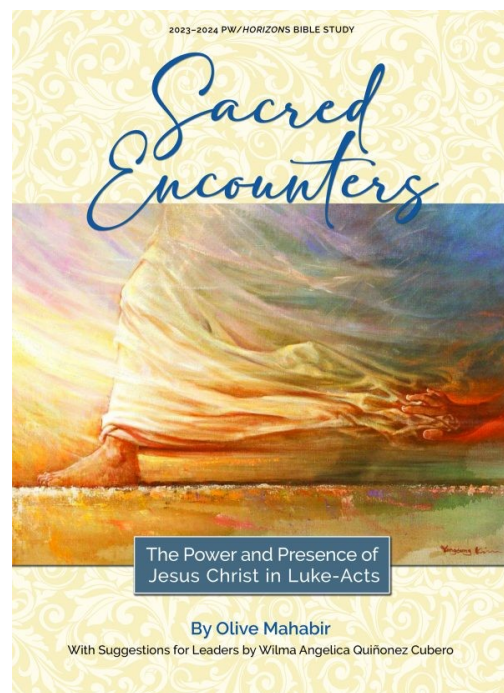
Men's Noon Lunch & Fellowship
