Did You Know?

During the Revolutionary War, Presbyterians were only one of the reformed denominations that dominated American colonial life. Presbyterians participated in the writing of state and national constitutions. In 1788, the synod met in Philadelphia to form the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the USA (PCUSA). It adopted a constitution that included a form of government, a directory of worship, and more. In 1789 first General Assembly held its first meeting in Philadelphia. In the early 1800's, the church carried revivals and organized congregations, presbyteries, and synods wherever they went, emphasizing the connectional nature of the church. Presbyterians helped as well to shape voluntary societies to encourage educational, missionary, evangelical, and reframing work.


